

CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

Presentations and Call for Abstracts\Presentations:

Original psychological research can be presented at EPC5, either as a poster or as an oral talk. Within each of the eight Symposia (two concurrent sessions each day), the scientific programme will be divided into 30 min invited Symposia Talks in the morning sessions and 20 min Contributed Talks in the afternoon (including questions). This timing will be strictly followed. Only PowerPoint, in PC format, will be supported for Symposia and Contributed Talks and it must be supplied on a USB memory stick. No other formats will be supported. A preview room will be available.

There are a limited number of slots available for Contributed Talks. If there are not enough time slots available for every one who wishes to give a Contributed Talk, the Committee may ask some authors to present posters instead.

Posters should be up to the size A0 (about 84 x 120 cm, Portrait only). Please include a photograph of the poster presenter on the upper right hand side of the poster. Please indicate if the poster is to be entered into the student poster prize competition.

Abstracts: All presenters of posters and talks should submit an Abstract, which should be formatted as follows. The text should contain no more than 300 words, and the whole abstract should be typed using Times New Roman font 12 pt., left aligned and with single spaced lines. The specific format is:

Title (in uppercase letters, 100 characters maximum including spaces); followed by one line space; followed by **author(s)**, with the Presenter's name underlined (followed by Email addresses in parentheses); followed by one line space; followed by affiliation(s); followed by one line space; followed by the **abstract** text (left margin aligned).

Please indicate on a final line if you wish to present your contribution as a Poster (indicate if the poster should be considered for the student prize competition) or as a Contributed Talk. Contributed Talks will be grouped to follow Symposia (see below), but other topics are welcome and will be grouped with similar topics. Please indicate which Symposium you think your talk best follows.

Each participant can be the Presenter of one Contributed Talk only, but you can be included as co-author in several presentations.

Please use the Abstract form on the website for your submission no later than **4 March 2011**. Please use spell check and use correct English grammar. Although this is the final date for receiving abstracts, please try to submit the abstract *as soon as possible*, because this will make it much easier for us to schedule your contribution into the relevant Symposium Session.
